OPERATIONS ORDER #152.

WEATHER ANNEX.

SYNOPTIC SITUATION 0600Z:

High pressure belt from S. Russia across Southern and Western Europe and the Western Mediterranean. Low in N. Finland with cold front extending from center of low to Southeastern Germany, becoming very weak in south portion.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: 2 to 3/10 cumulus with bases at 4000 ft., tops to 8 to 10000 ft.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 5,000' 50° 10 knots
10,000' 40° 10 knots
15,000' 20° 15 knots

ROUTE: Sky: 4 to 5/10 cumulus with bases at 4000 ft., tops to 10000 ft. over the Apennines. Remainder of route generally clear, except for few cumulus over Corsica.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 10,000' 30° 10 knots
15,000' 10° 15 knots
20,000' 10° 20 knots

TARGET: Sky: Clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 20,000' 270° 15 knots
25,000' 270° 15 knots

Surface Wind: Light and variable, but generally from the south.

RETURN: Generally clear to Apennines. 3 to 4/10 cumulus over mountains, with tops to 8000 ft. 2 to 3/10 cumulus with bases at 4000 ft., tops to 8000 ft. at Bases.

ALTERNATE FIELDS: All fields will remain open
