OPERATIONS ORDER # 118
WEATHER ANNEX:

SYNOPTIC SITUATION 0700Z.

Ridge of high pressure from Scandinavia through central Europe, Italy and Tripolitania. This ridge is tending to separate into a north cell and a south cell. Deep low approaching Bay of Biscay, moving slowly southeast.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 5000' 320 degrees 15 knots.
10000' 310 degrees 20 knots.
15000' 310 degrees 30 knots.

ROUTE: SKY: Clear over Adriatic with 4/10 to 5/10 cumulus at 8000' over Yugoslav mountains. Scattered low and middle clouds over Hungary, becoming 4/10 to 6/10 over Czechoslovakia, clearing rapidly north of mountains.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 25 miles in light haze.

Upper Winds: 10000' 310 degrees 20 knots.
15000' 300 degrees 25 knots.
20000' 260 degrees 15 knots.

TARGET: Sky: 3/10 to 4/10 low clouds. 1/10 to 2 10 middle cloud. Few scattered cirrus above 25,000'.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles.

Surface Wind: Easterly at 10 to 15 mph.
Upper Winds: 20000' 270 degrees 10 knots.
25000' 260 degrees 20 knots.

RETURN: Little change except diurnal increase in cumulus to 4/10 to 5/10 over bases on return.

ALTERATE FIELDS: All areas will remain open.
